RULES

Positive & Negative Numbers

- Positive numbers are greater than 0. To the right of 0 on a number line and get larger as you move further away from 0. Any number with a plus sign (+) before it is a positive number.
- Negative numbers are less than 0. To the left of 0 on a number line and get smaller as you move further away from 0. Any number with a minus sign (-) before it is a negative number.

Rules for Signs

- The sum of two positive numbers is a positive number.

$$(+5) + (+7) = +12$$

- The sum of two negative numbers is a negative number.

$$(-5) + (-7) = -12$$

- The sum of one positive number and one negative number can be positive or negative depending on the magnitude of the numbers. First add the absolute value of the numbers, then subtract the smaller from the larger.

$$(+5) + (-2) = 5 - 2 = 3$$

$$(-5) + (+2) = 5 - 2 = -3$$

Rules for Subtraction

- To subtract a positive number from a negative number, first change the sign of the number being subtracted, then add the numbers.

$$(-5) - (+2) = (-5) + (-2) = -7$$

Rules for Multiplication

- The product of two positive numbers is a positive number.

$$(+5) \times (+7) = +35$$

- The product of two negative numbers is a positive number.

$$(-5) \times (-7) = +35$$

Rules for Division

- The quotient of two positive numbers is a positive number.

$$(+5) \div (+7) = +0.71$$

- The quotient of two negative numbers is a negative number.

$$(-5) \div (-7) = +0.71$$

- The quotient of a positive number and a negative number is a negative number.

$$(+5) \div (-7) = -0.71$$

$$(-5) \div (+7) = -0.71$$

Alternative Properties

- Associative property: when only $a + b + c$ or $ab \cdot cd$, the first two terms in the parentheses may be combined first, then multiplied by the third term.

$$(+5) + (6 + 7) = +5 + 13 = 18$$

- Commutative property: the order of numbers in addition or multiplication does not matter.

$$(+5) + (+7) = +7 + (+5) = 12$$
